



Frequently Asked Questions

1. What time should I arrive?

Please arrive 5 minutes before the event is due to start and meet at the Visitor Centre

2. Is parking available?

We are unable to offer parking for most of our events with the exception of the Strange and Mysterious Tales of Cowdray. Parking for this event is available at the Walled Garden GU29 9AL

For other Cowdray Ruins events – there is a car park approximately 5-7 minutes' walk away from Cowdray Ruins on North Street, Midhurst, and further afield at Grange Road please see

3. Are guided tours/talks suitable for pushchairs and wheelchairs?

There is a step up to the Tudor kitchen and quite a tight turning circle to get into the kitchen which may preclude entry for both wheelchairs and pushchairs. Guided tours will include a mixture of tarmac and uneven grass surface so may not be suitable for wheelchair users.

4. Where do the tours take place?

The tours take place in the immediate vicinity of Cowdray Ruins and the Christmas Traditions talk will take place in the Tudor Kitchen. Please note that due to the nature of the site, the ground may be uneven, we advise wearing sensible footwear. Except for the Tudor Kitchen, there is no access to the interior of Cowdray Ruins.

5. Are toilets available?

There are toilets available in the Visitor Centre.

6. Do I need to book a ticket in advance?

Tickets need to be booked in advance online.

7. Are dogs allowed on site?

Dogs are not permitted on site with the exception of Assistance Dogs.

8. Can we visit the Tudor Tower?

Some talks will include a visit to the Tower Tower, access is not suitable for children under 8.
